

Show consideration for your neighbours

We would like to remind everyone in the area to be considerate, so that together we can preserve the peaceful and pleasant atmosphere at Hostrup Strand.

♦ Dogs must be kept on a leash

We would like to remind all dog owners to show consideration for neighbours, guests, wildlife and other dogs in the area.

According to Danish law, dogs must be kept on a leash in urban and holiday home areas unless they are under full control and do not disturb others. Many people feel uncomfortable around loose dogs, even if the dog is friendly.

Special rules apply on the beach:

- From 1 April to 30 September, dogs must always be kept on a leash
- From 1 October to 31 March, dogs may run free on the beach if they are under full control

Several people in the area have experienced loose dogs without their owners nearby, both on the beach and on the roads. Therefore, we encourage everyone to keep their dogs on a leash and show consideration for their surroundings.

♦ Burning garden waste

In Skive Municipality, it is not permitted to burn garden waste in holiday home areas – not even in small amounts. Garden waste should instead be composted, chipped or taken to one of the municipality's recycling stations. Burning waste is harmful to the environment and can be a major nuisance to neighbours.

♦ Noise

To ensure good neighbourly relations, we encourage everyone to limit the use of noisy machinery such as lawn mowers, hedge trimmers and chainsaws:

- Before 9:00 am
- Between 12:00 pm and 2:00 pm
- After 6:00 pm

This especially applies during weekends and the summer season, when many people enjoy the peace and quiet on their terraces.

PS: Craftsmen and contractors are naturally exempt.

♦ Speed and dust

Please also reduce your speed on the gravel roads.

If it creates dust, you are driving too fast – please slow down out of consideration for neighbours, pedestrians and the condition of the roads.

♦ Fireworks

Many people choose to celebrate New Year at their holiday homes at Hostrup Strand. To them we would like to say: Please be careful when using fireworks to avoid damage to people, buildings or vegetation.

Private individuals may only use approved fireworks from 31 December to 1 January inclusive. The use of fireworks during the rest of the year is illegal.

According to the Danish Safety Technology Authority's rules, minimum distances must be kept from buildings, thatched roofs, vegetation and animals:

- At least 10 metres from doorways and buildings when launching rockets
- At least 100 metres from thatched roofs, vegetation and flammable materials
- At least 200 metres when launching rockets near thatched roofs and vegetation
- At least 100 metres from farms with animals or fields with grazing animals
- In windy weather, the safety distances in the wind direction must be doubled
